

Maverick Perry Brief Reassessment

MASI-R Oral Reading Fluency Measures-October 30th 2018

Maverick was asked to read a passage at a Grade 1 level, out-loud. The test allows calculation of words-correct-per-minute (WCPM) and words-incorrect-per-minute (WIPM) and provides a measure of reading accuracy. Maverick was only able to read 15 words in a minute, so I read the passage to him. Maverick answered some comprehension questions following my reading of the passage.

The results are tabulated below.

MASI-R Oral Reading Fluency Measures-May 16th 2019

Maverick was again asked to read a passage at a Grade 1 level, out-loud. I used the same passage from the October testing. Maverick was now able to read 29 words in a minute, and he no longer sounded out every single word. He was still decoding one or two words, but his sight word knowledge (see my definition of a sight word below) has definitely increased. His fluency is now between the 10th and the 25th percentile at 1st grade, whereas in October it was at the 10th percentile.

We have been working intensely since last November on his ability to blend words accurately at the VC, CVC, VCC and CVCC levels. When Maverick came to me last year he was unable to read many words instantly at the VC or CVC level without decoding each individual letter. With a focus on orthographic mapping (encoding) first

and decoding second, we were eventually able to convert many of these words into “sight words” for him and help him break his guessing habit to some extent. Maverick is beginning to notice the same letter patterns in different words.

We have a long way to go, but Maverick has turned a corner and is now reading decodable readers at the CVC, VCC and CVCC level with fluency.

I feel he is now ready to start working on fluency phrases at a 1st grade level, so we can work to improve his accuracy and fluency. Maverick is not independent at a first grade reading level as of yet.

This is the definition of a sight word used by researcher: Any word that is immediately recognized “by sight,” that is, any previously learned words that are part of a person’s sight vocabulary, regardless of whether they are “regular” or “irregular.”

1	25	4	86% (Frustration for 1st grade)	Maverick read park as perk and then self corrected himself. He was unable to read people, walk, sidewalks and don’t (which he read as “do not”.)
